UN Presentation a Success

UNITED NATIONS

International March spokesperson Rafael de la Rubia addressed UN Delegates and NGO representatives attending the NPT Preparation

Conference at a special presentation on the World March for Peace and Nonviolence on at the United Nations on May 6. The presentation was sponsored by the Permanent Mission of Chile to the United Nations.

De la Rubia proposed that the heads-of-state endorsing the World March make a joint declaration of support at the opening of the UN General Assembly in September.

De la Rubia proposed that the heads-of-state endorsing the World March make a joint declaration of support at the opening of the UN General Assembly in September and asked the delegations to help organize a reception for the international team of marchers when they come to the UN on December 1. Logistical support from governments, including assistance with visas, lodging, transportation, and border crossings was also requested. Delegates from Argentina, China, Iran, Uruguay, Syria, Guatemala, Poland and Burkina Faso were receptive to the March and promised to share information with their

governments. Contact was also made with the Chinese delegation to bring the World March to China. Several present NGOs, including UNIFEM, endorsed the march.
